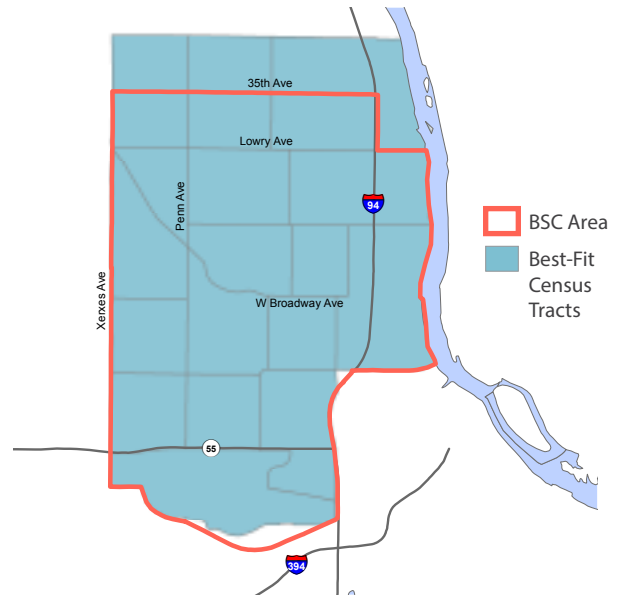


Moving Beyond the Gap – Racial Disparities in North Minneapolis

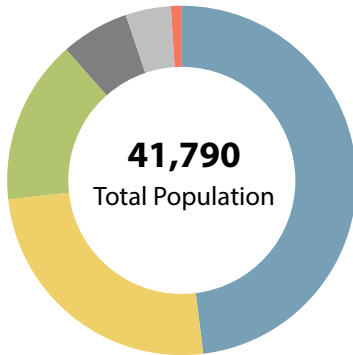

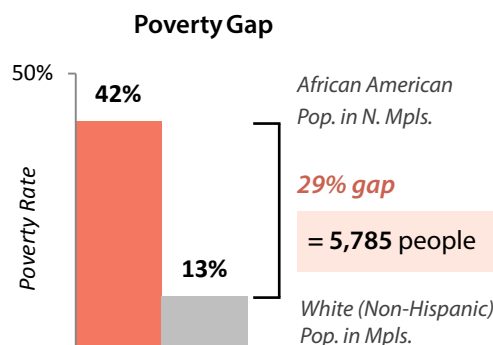
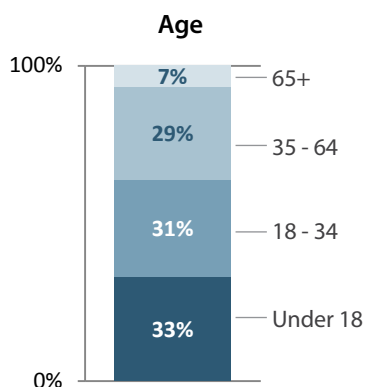
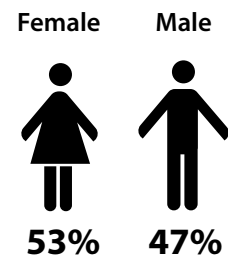
This report is part of a larger collaboration between the Local Initiatives Support Corporation (LISC) and the Center for Urban and Regional Affairs (CURA). It aims to inform community revitalization in the Twin Cities by analyzing neighborhood contributions to regional disparities between whites and other racial and ethnic groups. The report compares the North Minneapolis Building Sustainable Communities area to Minneapolis and the Region along a series of economic and community health indicators. It finds that closing the gap between whites and African Americans in North Minneapolis would make a significant contribution to narrowing disparities within the city and region as a whole.



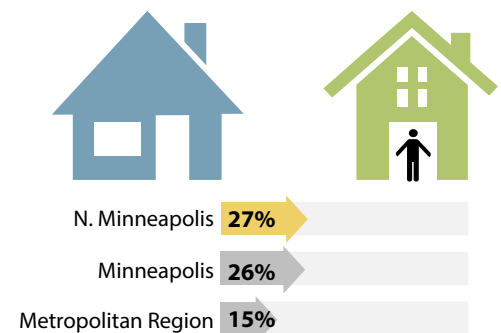

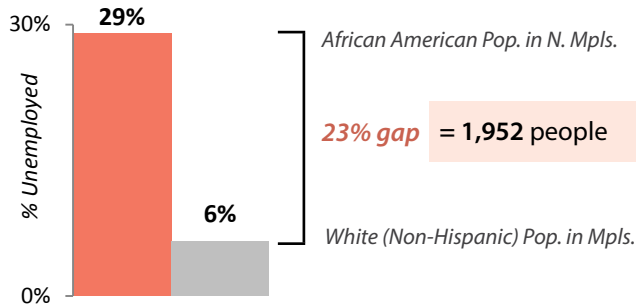


Percent Residents Moved in the Last Year

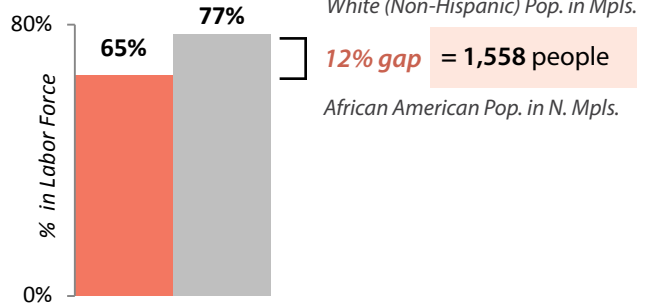

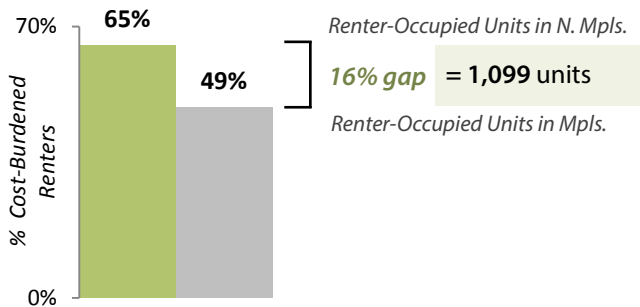
Unemployment Gap



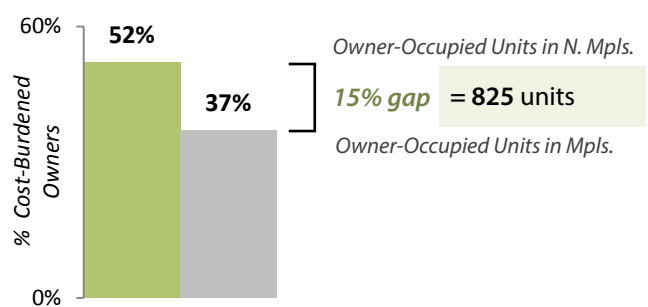
Labor Force Gap



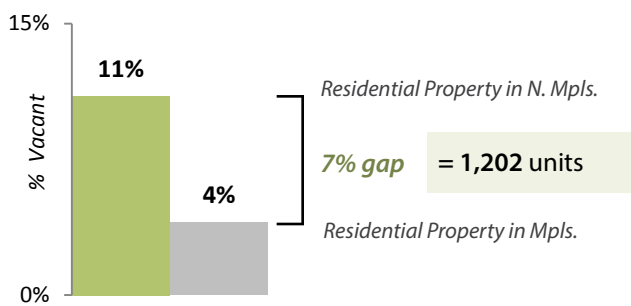
Cost-Burdened Gap (Renters)



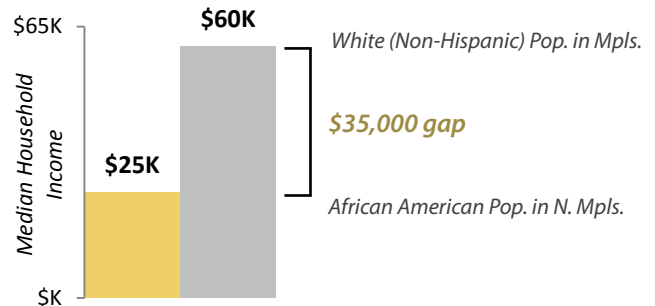
Cost-Burdened Gap (Owners)



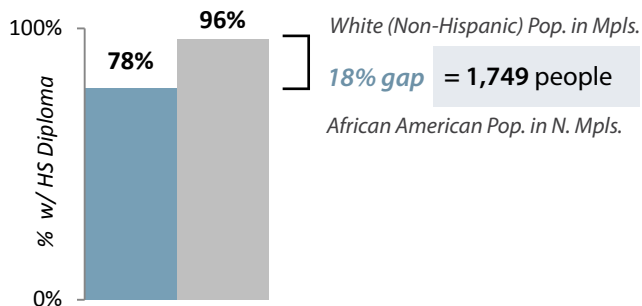
Vacancy Gap
